RESIDENTIAL STUDENT PARKING

All residential students with a vehicle on campus must have an active permit with Transportation Services each semester.

Students living on campus will be able to purchase fall semester parking permits in early August. Log into <u>ULink</u>, select "Campus Services," select "Access my Parking Account," and then select "Get Permit." There is a two-step process for obtaining a permit: 1) registering the vehicle to the parking account; and 2) purchasing the permit. Permits must be renewed each semester. The residential parking zones include:

• Zone 29R on Smith Street and Zone 27 along Rex Street.

Overflow parking for all of the residence halls above is located in Zone 15 (EK Long on Girard Park Circle).

Permit prices for each residential zone will be \$40 for the Fall semester.

COMMUTER STUDENT PARKING

All commuter students with a vehicle on campus (even those parking for free at Cajun Field) **must have an active permit** with Transportation Services each semester.

Students commuting to campus will be able to obtain fall semester parking permits in early August. Log into ULink, select "Campus Services," select "Access my Parking Account," and then select "Get Permit." There is a two-step process for obtaining a permit: 1) registering the vehicle to the parking account; and 2) obtaining or purchasing the permit.

Parking permits will be available starting in early August. Please encourage your student to monitor their University email for additional information.

COMMUTER STUDENTS HAVE THE FOLLOWING PARKING OPTIONS

- Free (with permit) Parking at Cajun Field: Commuters have the option to select the free commuter parking permit and ride the UL Lafayette transit buses to campus. Students should arrive at Cajun Field at least 45 minutes before class. Click here to see the transit schedule (Fall 2021 schedule will be available soon).
- Girard Park Circle Parking Tower Permit: This on-campus parking permit may be purchased through ULink for \$325 per semester (permits must be renewed each semester). This location offers 900 guaranteed permit parking spaces on floors three through six. These do sell out quickly due to the fixed number of parking spaces for this area.

HOURLY PARKING

Hourly parking is available daily at two on-campus locations and three near-campus locations.

- On-Campus Locations: The Girard Park Circle Parking Tower (floors 1-3) are available for hourly parking. The price is \$5 for the first 2 hour minimum and \$1 per hour thereafter. Two payment options for this location include: the kiosks located by the elevators and stairs or the ParkMobile app. The second oncampus hourly parking lot is located at the corner of UPA Drive and South Campus Drive (near Cajun Village Apartments). Hourly parking is allowed inside the lot from the corner to the ParkMobile signs. Payment for this location is only available through the ParkMobile app.
- Near-Campus Locations: Three hourly parking lots near campus are located at 101 Mildred Street, 119 West St. Mary Street (behind the Burger King) and 333 East University Street. Payment for these locations is only available through the ParkMobile app.

Additional hourly parking options are available after 4:30 pm daily. These additional lots include areas reserved for employee permit only parking during the day. These locations may be viewed on the ParkMobile app after 4:30 pm Monday through Friday.



HANDICAP PARKING

Any individual who requires special accommodations for handicap parking on campus should contact the Office of Transportation Services and provide appropriate state issued credentials in order to obtain a handicap parking permit.

Vehicles in handicap spots without displaying the proper state issued credentials will face a \$300 citation from the University and may be immobilized or towed at the owner's expense. If immobilized, a \$100 fine is added to the balance due and all fines must be paid prior to removal.

VISITOR PARKING

Guests may pay at the kiosks to park hourly in the Girard Park Circle Parking Tower first through third floors or any of the ParkMobile lots. For more information about ParkMobile, visit ParkMobile at UL.

Free 30-minute parking is available in the side lot of the Student Union.

WHAT STUDENTS NEED FOR PARKING AT UL LAFAYETTE:

Transportation Services utilizes virtual parking permits and LPR (license plate recognition) for enforcement. Decals and hangtags are not issued. License plate recognition software is used to identify parking privileges in all locations. When registering for parking on campus, it is imperative that the plate number is entered correctly. When registering, and obtaining a semester permit, students will need:

- Student ULID
- Phone number
- Home address
- Assigned housing community (if an on-campus resident)
- License plate number and state of issue
- Vehicle year, color, make, and model

IMPORTANT PARKING REMINDERS


- Parking regulations remain in place 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Any parked vehicle must be registered with the Office of Transportation Services or parked in one of the pay-by-the-hour zones with time paid.
- A vehicle may be immobilized or towed after it has accumulated three unpaid citations.

CAMPUS SHUTTLE

The University provides transportation from main campus to the satellite facilities of Bourgeois Hall and Cajun Field. <u>View the most up-to-date transit schedule online here.</u> On-Call Shuttles are also available, during specified hours, by calling 337-482-5305.

LIVE BUS TRACKING

All buses are equipped with tracking devices that allow students to see live information on bus locations. Download the official UL Lafayette app and select "Track Buses." Select the type of route you would like and you will see all buses on that particular route along with all stops associated with it. You can get estimated times of arrival for any of the stops.



BICYCLE INFORMATION

UL Lafayette is a bike-friendly campus offering special bike lanes on St. Mary Blvd. and multiple bike racks across campus. All bikes on campus must comply with state requirements and regulations. Students must have lights and reflective materials on their bikes, and should only ride on streets and not sidewalks. Read more about the Rules of the Road for bicycles, and be sure to have your student register their bike. Other rules include:

- Bicycles must be secured to a bike rack. Individuals are encouraged to use a U-bolt lock as they are the most secure.
- Bicycles cannot be secured to handrails, fences, trash receptacles, trees, trip rails, sign posts or anything other than a bike rack.
- Bicycles not properly secured to a bike rack will be impounded by Transportation Services.
- Bicycles that remain in bicycle racks or other places 7 days after the end of the semester will be impounded by Transportation Services. Bicycles that remain unclaimed for 6 months will be disposed of according to State of Louisiana rules and regulations.
